

4. GRETA THUNBERG

6. INDEPENDENCE DAY

11. RECYCLING

Recycling can be defined as the process of converting waste materials into new materials and objects. It contributes to the prevention of the waste of potentially useful materials and reduces the consumption of fresh raw materials, thereby reducing: energy usage, air pollution (from incineration), and water pollution (from landfilling).

12. DIGITAL DIVIDE

The term *digital divide* refers to the gap between those who have ready access to computers and the Internet, and those who do not. More precisely, it is an economic and social inequality with regard to access to, use of, or impact of information and communication technologies (ICT). This definition includes the skills to make use of ICT as an important element.

23. NEW YORK CITY

New York is the most populous city in the United States and the center of the New York metropolitan area. 26. RENEWABLE ENERGY

Renewable energy is energy that is **environment-friendly** because it is collected from renewable resources, which are naturally replenished. Examples include sunlight, wind, rain, tides, waves, and geothermal heat (i.e. the thermal energy generated and stored in the Earth). There is a distinction between *renewable energy* and *alternative energy*. The latter is generated from alternatives to fossil fuels and need not be renewable.

27. UNICEF

UNICEF stands for United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund. It was created by the United Nations General Assembly in 1946 to provide emergency food and health care to children in countries that had been devastated by World War II. Its programs emphasize developing community-level services to promote the health and well-being of children.

28. TYPES OF ART

Art refers to a diverse range of human activities in creating visual, auditory or performing artifacts. The oldest form of art are *visual arts*, which include creation of images or objects in fields including painting, sculpture, printmaking, photography, and other visual media. Music, theater, film, dance, and other *performing arts*, as well as literature and other media such as interactive media, are included in a broader definition of 'art or the arts'.
